His purpose, he said, will be to channel more, rather than less, information to the public and "eliminate every possibility of a credibility gap."

It was not immediately clear how tight a rein Klein would hold over cabinet-level departments and other agencies in their dealings with the press and the public. He said he would not expect top appointees to the Nixon team to stick closely to any "party line" in their public statements. But he added that he anticipated close coordination between his office and that of department and agency leaders.

Nixon was putting in a full day of office meetings in his quarters at the Pierre Hotel. In the morning he saw Dr. Henry Kissinger, a frequent consultant at governmental levels who is associated with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

During much of the week, Nixon plans to be meeting with prominent GOP office holders about federal appointments and programs.

NEGROES BOYCOTT FOUR DECATUR HIGH SCHOOLS

Decatur (AP)

About 300 Negro pupils walked out of their high school home rooms today and announced that they would boycott classes.

Most Negro pupils in Decatur's four high schools took part in the boycott. Negroes constitute about seven per cent of the city's high school enrollment of 5,000.

The walkout took place at 8:15 a.m. after the start of the day's home room session.

On leaving the four schools, the pupils gathered in a community center for a meeting.

It was learned that a list of demands was presented by the pupils to officials at one school.

The boycott was the first of its kind in Decatur.
