Libya also to use oil as weapon

Triopoli, Libya (AP)

Libya on Friday joined other Arab nations using oil as a weapon against Israel halting oil exports to the United States, cutting production by 5 per cent and raising its oil prices.

The Libyan News Agency reported the series of government oil moves.

The agency said Libya's posted price of crude oil was increased by nearly \$2 a barrel.

Over-all U.S. oil imports from the Middle East amount to about 6 per cent of the 17 million barrels of oil America consumes a day. Libya contributes only a small amount to the total imports from the Middle East.

Six Persian Gulf states increased market oil priced by 17 per cent on Tuesday. That action and threats from 10 Arab nations to impose 5 per cent monthly cutbacks in production were followed by a Saudi Arabian announcement that it was curtailing production by 10 per cent. Saudi Arabia is the third largest supplier of oil to the United States behind Canada and Venezuela.

The reported aim of the Arab oil offensive on the West is to persuade Israel's friends, particularly the United States, to curb their support of the Israeli war effort and to induce Israel to agree to a peace settlement satisfactory to the Arabs.

Cairo's official Middle East News Agency said Egypt had its own commandos fighting behind Israeli lines on the east bank of the canal and that they were "destroying supply routes and enemy rear administrative centers in various parts of Sinai."

Gen. Shlomo Gazit, a military spokesman in Tel Aviv, said the west bank task force knocked out 10 missile batteries. Some of the captured SAM missile units were intact, he said.

Charge HHH g soybean

The special Watergate prosecutor's office filed charges Friday alleging that soybean magnate Dwayne O. Anderson and First Interoceanic Company violated federal campaign laws with a \$100,000 contribution to the 1968 Democratic presidential campaign of Hubert H. Humphrey.

The charges, filed in U.S. District Court in Minneapolis, were announced by the special prosecutor's office in Washington.

There was no immediate comment from Humphrey's Senate office. A spokesman said he had left Washington for the weekend. He was elected U.S. senator from Minnesota in 1970.

In an eight-count criminal
