# Schools cooler, darker as cutbacks take effect

Schools throughout the Champaign - Urbana area are following new regulations adopted by their boards of education recently to conserve energy.

Thermostats in most classrooms and other areas are being kept below 70 degrees during the school day. The only exceptions are in some rooms used by kindergarten and primary pupils.

Temperatures are being lowered further at night, on weekends and during school vacations.

Teachers and custodians have been instructed to turn off lights in rooms which are not in use.

Almost all area schools are reducing the use of buses for field trips. The boards of most districts operating high schools which have run buses to transport pupils to sports events as spectators have agreed that less gasoline will be used by continuing the practice. If there were no spectator buses, it is pointed out, many pupils would drive automobiles to games.

Shortages of fuel for school buses have been a continuing problem. Many school boards learned last summer that bulk plans which had supplied them

in the past were finding it difficult to promise all the fuel needed for the current school term.

It has been necessary to get along with smaller deliveries, make purchases more frequently and pay higher prices.

No reports have been received of the suspension of regular bus runs for transportation of pupils to and from school. No athletic events or other extracurricular activities have been canceled so far because of the energy crisis.
