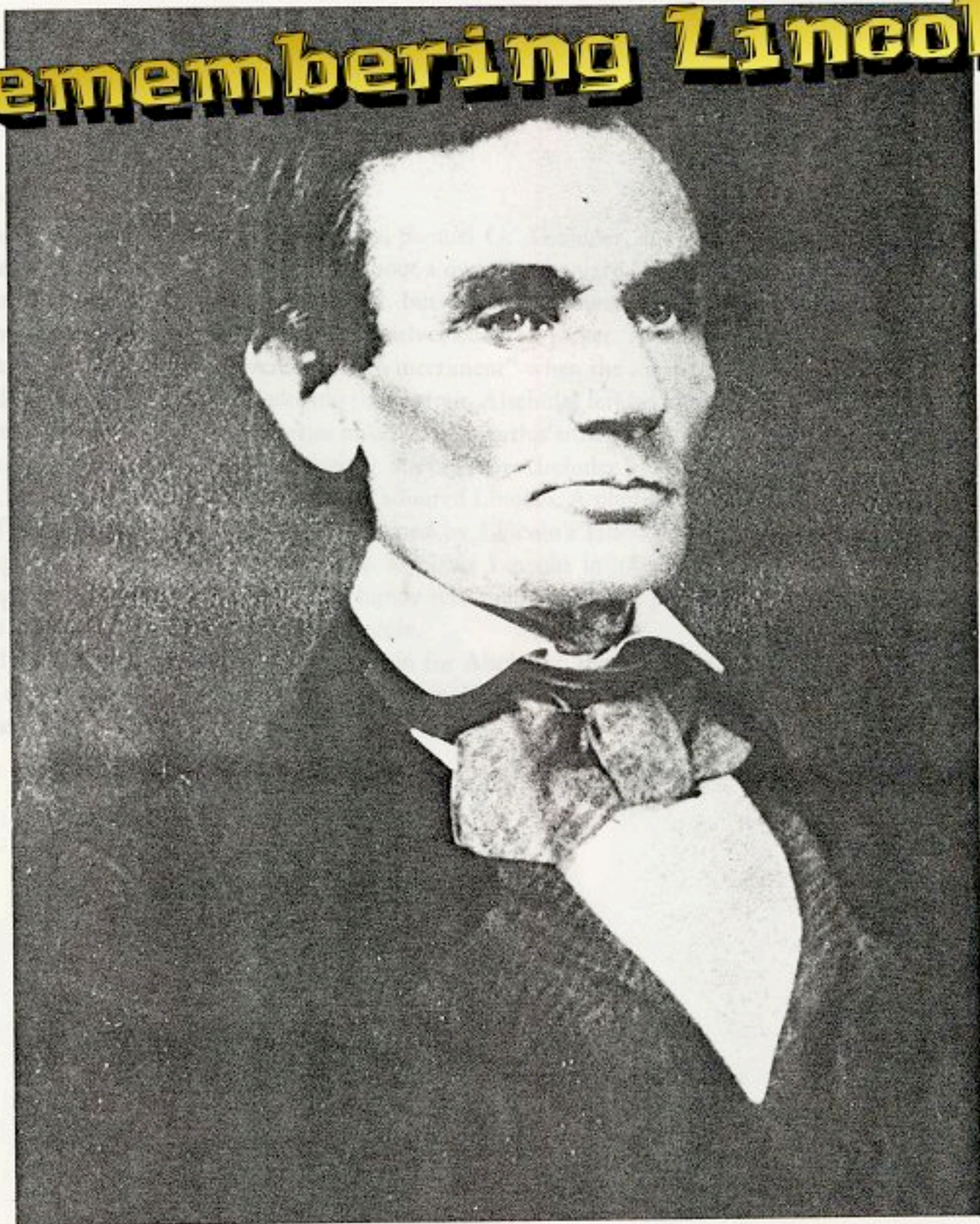

Urbana, Illinois, April 25, 1858.

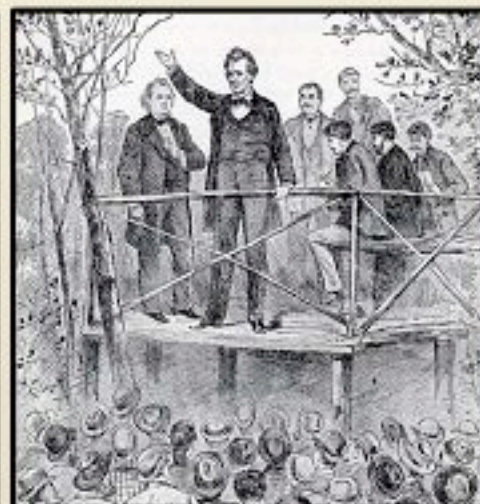
AS A KID, LINCOLN WAS A POOR FARM KID WHO LOVED LEARNING

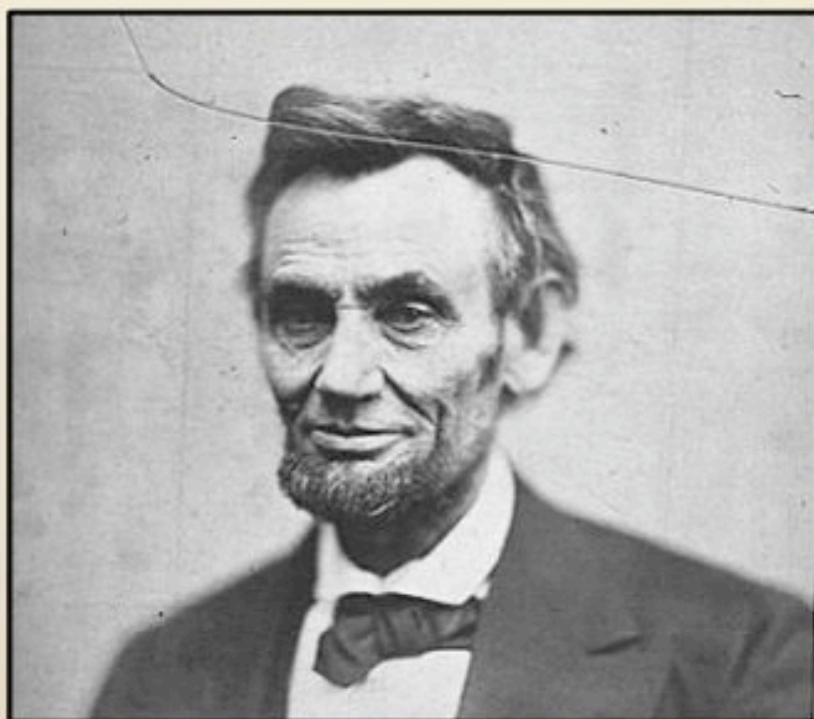


DESPITE A THREAT OF SECESSION BY THE SOUTH, AND SOME ANGER IN THE NORTH OVER HIS NOMINATION, ABRAHAM LINCOLN WINS THE PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION OF 1860.





LINCOLN'S ELECTION STARTED A CIVIL WAR. BROTHERS FOUGHT AGAINST BROTHERS, AND THE STABILITY OF THE NATION WAS AT STAKE. THE WAR WAS DEVASTATING AND WORE HEAVILY ON LINCOLN. HE WAS CONSTANTLY UNDER DEATH THREAT, HE WAS COMPLETELY STRESSED, AND IT SHOWED ON HIS FACE.



AS THE CIVIL WAR ENDED, AND SLAVES WERE FINALLY FREE, MANY SOUTHERNERS WERE NOT HAPPY WITH THE RESULT.

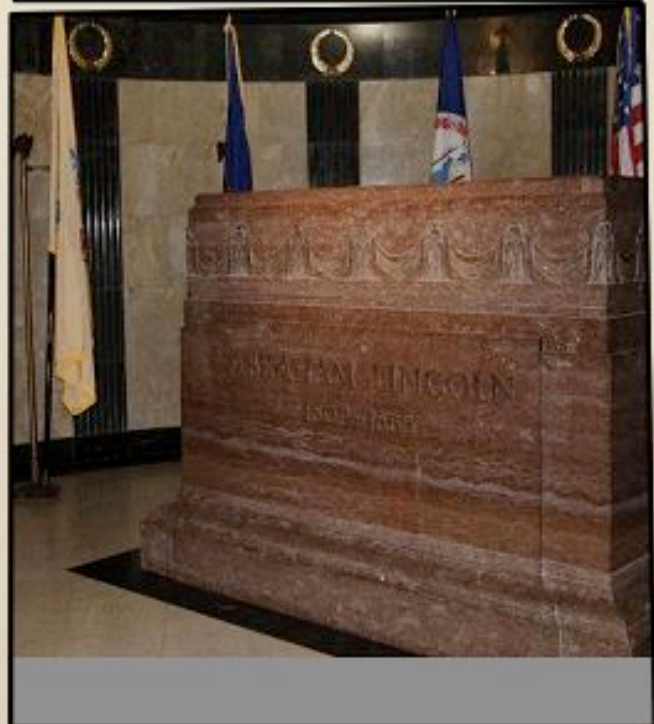

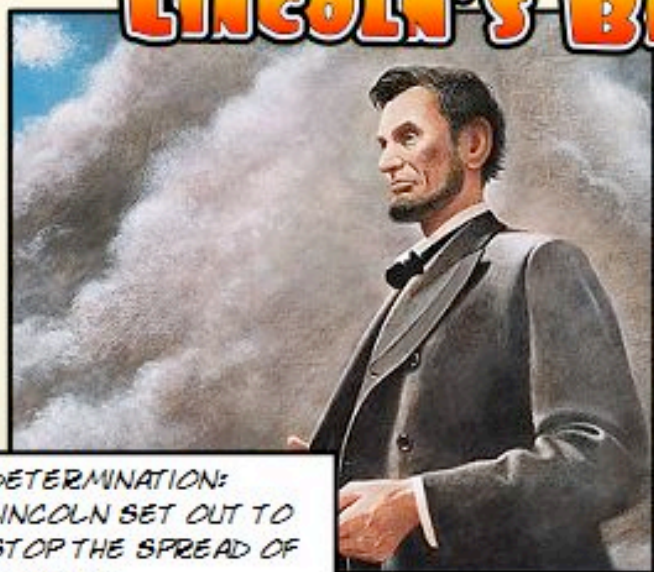

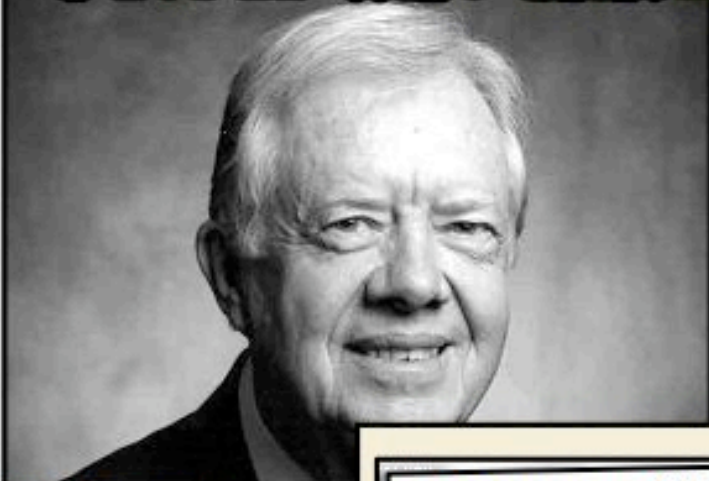


WISDOM: HE COULD SEE THE BIG PICTURE, AND KNEW HOW TO GET OTHER TO BACK HIM.

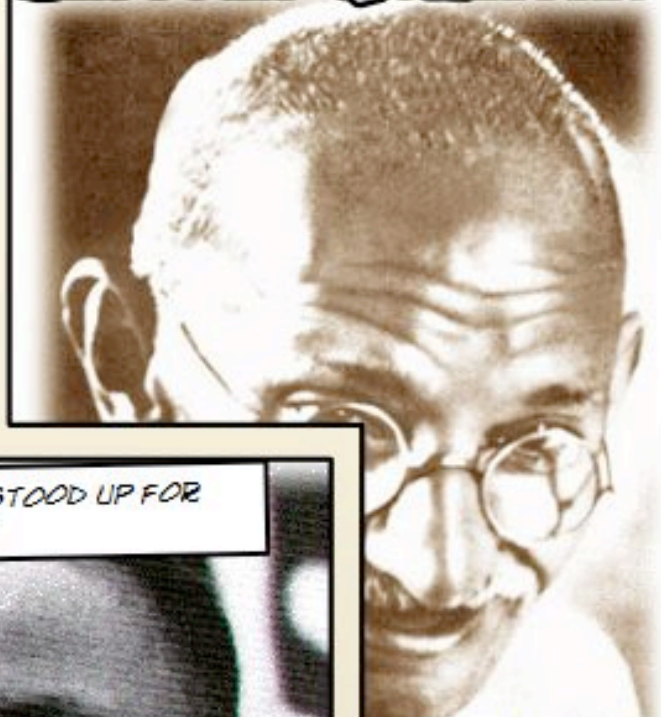

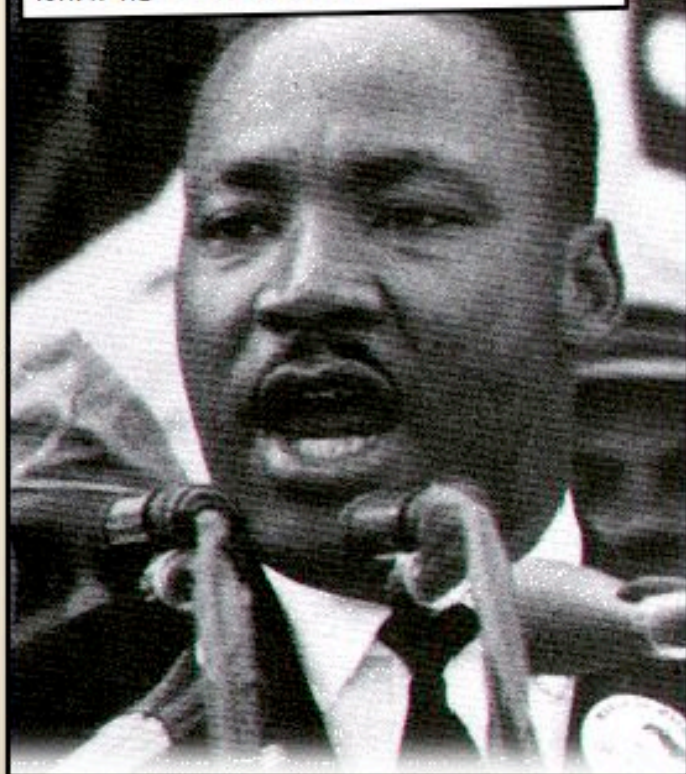


A BIG HEART: JIMMY CARTER HAS SPENT HIS LIFE HELPING THE POOR GET ON THEIR FEET.

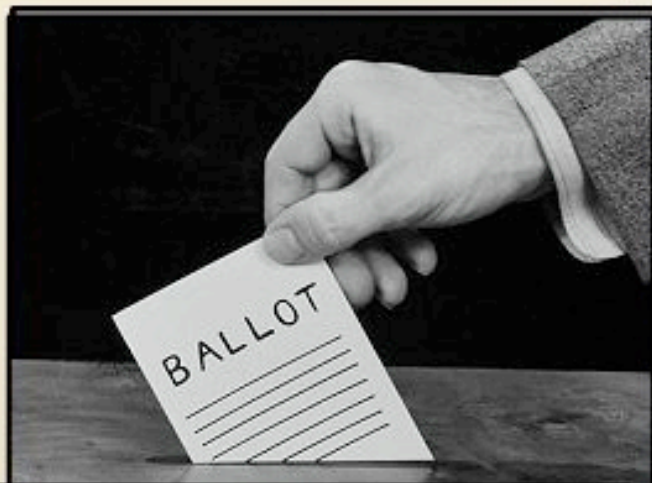

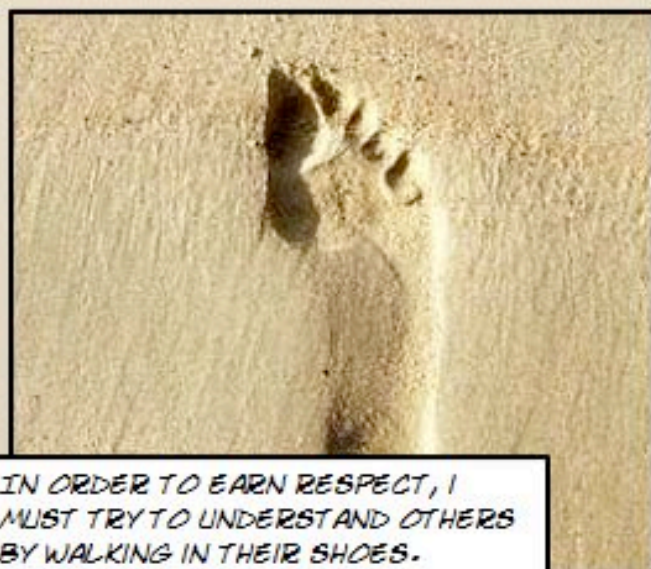

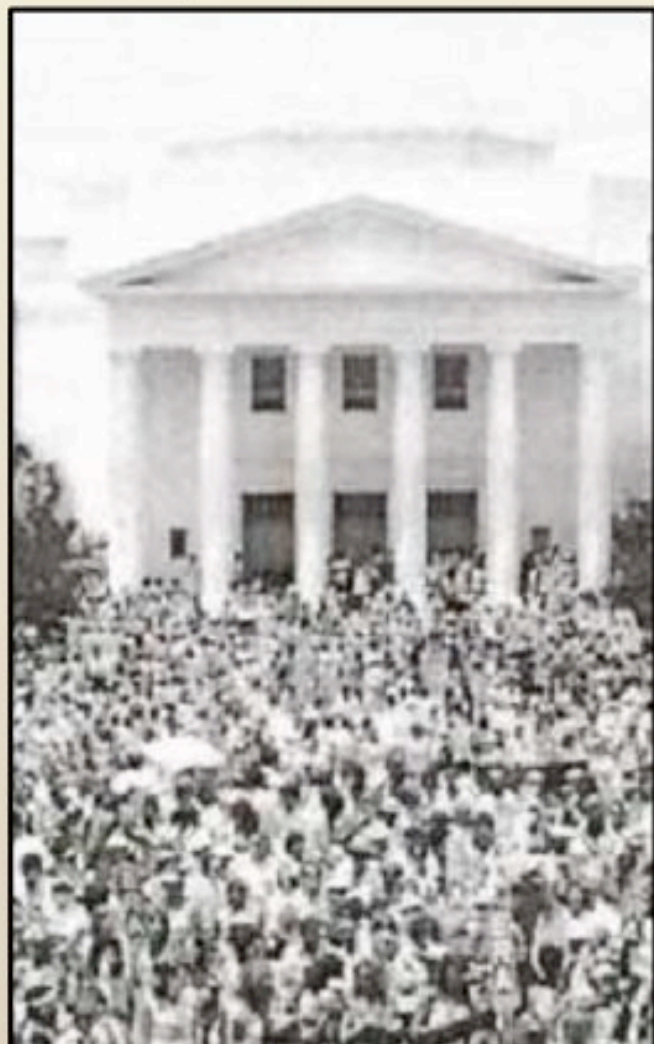
EARNING RESPECT MEANS SETTING GOALS AND WORKING TO ACHIEVE THEM.
