Make an I-Chart – I stands for Inquiry. In the left column you write questions that you/your students want answered. Across the top you write down the different resources you use to answer the questions. In each square, you write the answers.

Example: Make a grid on a big piece of Bulletin Board Paper on the board and fill it in as the week progresses and you find the answers or develop more questions.
