Give Recommendations in Reference to the Work of Classes or Individual Pupils, Reviews, Promotions, Etc., also needs in Apparatus, Books, Etc.

Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 28, 31 will take second year work.  
 Nos. 4, 5, 6, 7, 26, 30 will all take 3rd year work. No 4 needs urging. Nos. 26, 30 attend very irregularly.  
 No 29 takes 4th year work during 1921-22.  
 Nos. 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 27 will take fifth grade work.  
 Nos. 15, 16, took 5th year work during 1920-21 in everything except Arithmetic which they took with the sixth year. They will take 6th in everything but Arith. and will take 7th in that. Nos. 15, 16 are good students when they try. Teacher must use tact in disciplining them.  
 Nos. 18, 19, 20, 21 will take seventh year work in everything that is the work outlined in the State Course of Study for the seventh grade in country schools. The eighth year work in everything except Arithmetic and English and seventh in those.  
 No. 29 is an apt student and needs to be kept busy.

*Attendance was very poor during influenza epidemic.*

Nov. 1, 2, 3, 4 (and might try 20) will all be in 2nd reader, (all start together right from the beginning). Lucile S. will be in 1st reader. No 4 must be urged some. Nov. 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 also 11 must all take 4th years work.

Nov 12 and 13 will take 5th year's work but have to urge them for punctuality and attendance.

Nov. 16, 17, 18, 20 and 21 will all take 6th year's work. No 21 is not very good in Arith. but very good in other subjects. No. 20 must study hard to keep up with class. This whole 6th yr. class will take Geog. instead of Hist. the next term (1920-21)

No 29 entered late and wasn't so very good in his studies but will take 5th yr. work in every thing except Arith. and Gram. and 7th yr. in those. He needs more study.

No 22 and 23 did good work throughout term and both passed County final, they must both take 7th years work in all studies except Arith. and Gram. and take 8th in those two.
