FILIBUSTER HALTS ACTION ON 2,000,000 ARMY BILL

## PACIFISTS FEAR DRAFT RIOTS

Modified Army Staff Bill Puts Responsibility for Draft Upon ident Unless He Consessor Trying Out Volunteer Pi

(By the United Press.) Washington April 21,-The admin istration's selective conscription army bill struck an unexpected snag in the stenate this afternoon following a spirited committee hearing of anti-Senator conscription pacifists. Thompson this afternoon started fillbuster tactics to delay consideration of the question of raising an army of 2,000,000 to defend, the country. Thompson at the close of the morning hour, which is devoted merely to routine business demanded the regular order, which was yesterday shunted aside so that decate on the spy bill was postponed, giving the army measure precedence over all other matters:

In the meantime the house military committee reported out the army general staff bill so modified and to shift re-sponsibility for the use of the selective draft system to President Wilson unless he should consent to try out the volunteer system first. Predict Draft Riots.

Washington, April 21.—Predicting serious "draft" riots if conscription goes into effect, a score of anti-conscriptionists apeared beforse the sen ate military affairs committee today. The committee granted them two hours to put their objections on record.

## Amended Bill Reported Out.

Washington, April 21.—The house military committee today voted 12 to 8 to report out the general staff army bill with an amendment "authorizing" the president to call for volunteeers if he wishes to, before the selective draft is resorted to. Representative Caldwell, New York, who previously had voted for the volunteer provision, voted "present."
