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Work For 3,6 County's

Many Plans Rushed to Office Before Deadline Friday Midnight; Boneyard Incomplete.

Works progress administration projects for the employment of 8.000 men in Champaign county, far more than enough to take care of the county's entire relief load, had been submitted to WPA Saturday.

Fred Lohmann, WPA engineer, had on file or had submitted to the Decatur office Saturday morning projects which would employ 2.400 men, according to the estimates of the sponsors. Several additional projects had been submitted directly to Decatur and a project, which will employ 600 men were to be submitted later in the day. All of the projects will go to the Chicago office over the week-end.

Urbana Project Largest

The largest project submitted Friday was a brick pavement repair job for the city of Urbana, totaling \$201,005, to employ 250 men. Other projects sent to Decatur during the last 24 hours before the deadline included Scott township road graveiling, \$107,400; Sadorus township road graveiling, \$107,400; Sadorus township road graveling, \$146,092; Champaign pavement relaying, \$107,730; Raymond township, farm to market roads, \$108,497; East Bend township road graveling, \$105,661.
