## Wilson Speaks To Supervisors

Former IERC Official Explains Applications For Projects.

RALPH Wilson of Decatur, supervisor of projects and planning in this WPA d strict, addressed Champaign county township supervisors, township highway commissioners, and township clerks in the grand jury room of the court house.
Thursday morning.

His talk consisted of a discussion of WPA programs relative to township highway work end an outline of what his department expects. The township officials were advised as to the methods by which they could get the most out of their WPA programs.

Mr. Wilson stressed the point that the more labor they are a to use on a project, the more assistance on materials and other service they will receive from PWA. He also emphasized the importance of making out accurate applications, stating that this is the most important single step in the whole program.

The officials were cautioned to make a distinction between WPA (Works Progress Administration) and PWA (Public Works Administration). Complete information regarding the differences is being prepared and will be announced soon. For the present, it will suffice for the township officials to know that applications on farm-to-market roads, regardless of cost are to be made to WPA. They also were instructed to combine all possible work in one application.
