When you complete your research, I would like you to create a flowchart of the steps you took in research. ALL flowcharts will start with the letter to Abel and include and primary source materials or articles that we looked at in class over the course of the unit. That part of the flowchart will look the same. Where the flowcharts will look different will be where your individual question research takes you. (Kind of like the Choose Your Own Adventure Books).

What will be done then at the end of the unit is:

A paper that answers your research question
Flowchart demonstrating the path your research took.
