However, as times changed and filmmakers took more control of their work, women's roles became more complex and the movies more rewarding. This one night seminar will trace the history of women's roles in the movies and examine how they have changed over the years, reflecting the changes in American society regarding women's growing independence. Films to be discussed include *Mildred Pierce, The Furies, Johnny Guitar, Looking for Mr. Goodbar,* and *Aliens* among others.
