Urbana School District #116 Board of Education Meeting Synopsis February 19, 2008

The Urbana School District #116 Board of Education Meeting was called to order at 7:31 p.m., by Board President Mark Netter. There were no citizen statements.

The board recognized the following students who attended the Illinois Music Educators Association All-State Conference: All State Choir - Liesel Booth; Honors Choir - Timothy Sands; Honors Orchestra (Piccolo) - Samantha Schwartz, All-State Orchestra (Violin I) - Aaron Schwartz; Honors Band (Trombone) - Peter Deal; All-State Band (Clarinet) - Julie Weatherhead.

The board then heard a presentation by Mary Kane of Stifel, Nicolaus and Company about the state law entitled the County School Facility Sales Tax. The state law, passed in October of 2007, allows a county to levy up to a 1% sales tax (except for cars, boats, RVs, mobile homes, food, drugs, farm equipment, and farm parts). The revenue from the tax would be proportionally distributed to all public schools in the county to be used for school district land, buildings, structures, and durable equipment. Kane says if a 1% sales tax is levied, District 116 could see \$3.1 million per year. The money could be used for "pay as you go" projects, to leverage revenue for current needs, to retire existing debt, or for any combination of the former. The County School Facility Sales Tax would have to be approved in a referendum by county voters and it would require cooperation between all county public school districts. The school board heard the presentation and plans to continue researching the issue.

Cope Cumpston was a guest at the Urbana Rotary Club and she reported that the UHS Interact Club had a very nice presentation.
